## Asbestos Management Plan

Southeastern Local School District has completed the Building Re-inspection and Management Plan Update for our buildings in our District and will continue Surveillance Inspections each six months as required by the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act of 1986 (AHERA).

AHERA Regulations require all buildings be re-inspected for asbestos containing building materials and a Management Plan Update developed for the management of asbestos containing materials by a certified consulting firm. This has been completed by Carl Frazier, Certified Asbestos Hazard Evaluation Specialists, Springfield, OH 45501.

Non-friable asbestos has been discovered on the bottom of stainless steel sinks, floor tile, and friable thermal (pipe, tank and boiler) insulation. These areas pose no health hazard except when damaged. Much of the asbestos containing materials have been removed since the initial removal in 1989.

The over all condition of the asbestos containing materials is good and management procedures are now in effect to control the asbestos exposure.

School personnel are trained in safe methods in dealing with damaged asbestos containing materials (ACM) in emergencies. We will, however; be removing the ACM based on the hazard assessment and as funds become available.

It is significant to report to you that the buildings in your district have been well maintained in regard to the immediate asbestos problem, and we will continue to maintain the ACM in as safe a condition as possible until removal.

The Re-inspection Report and Management Plan Update for each building is located in the Building Office. You are welcome to inspect and read the report as you desire, but it cannot be removed from the office. You may have copies made for a small charge. ## Message from the Superintendent:

The 2010/2011 school year is fast approaching. I would like to welcome back our students and parents for the coming school year. I hope that all of our students are having a great summer. Southeastern Local School District has been diligently working this summer to prepare for the new school year. Here are some of the highlights:

We have hired two new teachers for the 2010/2011 school year, Ms. Kelly Gootee and Ms. Lacey Myers. Ms. Gootee, a graduate of Kenton Ridge High School and Wright State University, will be teaching general music to grades 4 through 6 and the 8<sup>th</sup> grade. She will also be teaching vocal music for grades 9 through 12.

Ms. Myers, a recent graduate from the University of Toledo, comes to us from Paulding, Ohio. She is licensed to teach integrated science grades 7-12. Ms. Myers will be teaching an inquiry based science class to the 7<sup>th</sup> grade and a physical science class to the 8<sup>th</sup> grade.

Southeastern Local School District would like to welcome both Ms. Gootee and Ms. Myers. We are very pleased to have these teachers on board and will be expecting great things from them in the coming years.

In addition to the hiring of two new teachers, the district purchased new pre-algebra text books and active chemistry text books for the entire 7<sup>th</sup> grade and active physics text books for the entire 8<sup>th</sup> grade. Southeastern has also renewed its pledge for getting students current technologies with new "Smart Boards" for all teachers grades K through 4 and 60 new computers for computer labs throughout the school district.

The renovation project at the jr/sr high school is complete. The central office areas have been converted into two math classrooms and a computer lab. The FCCLA spaces are now two science rooms and a special education classroom. The FCCLA classroom has been relocated to the third floor with new counter tops, electrical service, ceiling tiles and floor tiles.

The area behind the football bleachers has been asphalted and striped. The new parking lot provides an additional 90 spaces for parking. Current drainage has been relocated and new catch basins have been added to aid in the removal of standing water from the new parking lot area.

We are looking forward to a great year that will have our students achieving their goals at Southeastern Local School District.

## Waiver of School Fees

The Southeastern Local School District shall waive fees assessed by the District only for students whose parent(s) or guardian are unable to afford them. The Superintendent may, as deemed necessary, establish additional procedures to supplement the procedures established in this policy regarding the requests for the waiver of fees.

### Eligibility Standards

Students eligible for a waiver of school fees include, but are not limited to, the following:

- A. Students who qualify for free lunches or breakfasts under the School Free Lunch Program Act.
- B. Students whose families have suffered very significant losses of income due to severe illness or injury in the family or unusual expenses including, but not limited to, fire, flood, or storm damage.
- C. Other good and just reasons.

Parents should request a waiver form from their Building Principal.
