IMPORTANT

Very few children qualify for early entrance for kindergarten. Surveys of local school districts show around 5% of those that apply for early entrance meet the standards needed to begin. Please make sure you proceed with childcare arrangements as a contingency. If you are selecting a preschool, you should register as you normally would if your child wasn't attending kindergarten. But let the preschool know that your child is being screened for early entrance to kindergarten.

A Parent's Guide to Early Entrance to Kindergarten

Is early entrance to kindergarten the best choice for my child?

Early entrance should be viewed as a means of meeting a child's needs as a whole. The key to determining whether or not early entrance is appropriate for a child is his or her developmental readiness. This includes not only academic ability but social maturity, personal development, and motor skills.

Early entrance is designed for the exceptional child who is both academically ready, as well as, developmentally mature when compared to others his or her chronological age.

Some questions you should ask yourself when considering early entrance:

- Is my child capable of working in a classroom setting with children who are one or two years older than he or she?
- Will my child become frustrated with their placement either academically or developmentally?
- What are the long term impacts as my child progresses through their educational career (e.g. participating in extracurricular and other curricular activities with students that are older, graduating high school at an early age, starting college at a younger age)?
- Is early entrance a want not a need? Early entrance is not designed as a replacement for childcare. Preschool or daycare may be a better option for your child.
- Does my child have ability and achievement skills? Some children have high level abilities at an
 early age simply because of their access to opportunities and environment. Early entrance is
 designed for the child that has high ability but also and easily achieve new material when
 presented to him or her.
- Do I understand the expectations of kindergarten students today?

What is expected of students in kindergarten today?

Kindergarten has changed considerably since you were in school. The expectations for kindergarten students are higher and their program is much more demanding. Here are some guidelines of what to expect:

You can access the *Early Learning Standards* on the Ohio Department of Education Website. This is an excellence resource to determine if your child is on track academically, socially, emotionally, and physically prior to entering kindergarten.

Type in the Search tab on ODE website: Early Learning Standards

The Ohio Department of Education provides parents with a Kindergarten Readiness Checklist, which can also help you determine if your child is ready for kindergarten. A copy of the list is below. Ask yourself the following questions:

Once a decision has been made for early entrance, the choice is difficult to reverse. Kindergarten at Southeastern Local School District is a full-day, everyday program. Students are expected to participate in the entire kindergarten program throughout the school year.

<u>Process</u>

If you believe your child is a good candidate for early entrance, fill out the early entrance application and return it to Miami View Elementary.

After the application is received, the school will follow the early entrance guidelines listed in the parent handbook on the school website.
