The CCCC origination was mainly contributed to E. Lawrence Brooks Jr., (1923 - 1990) who loved coins. He owned and operated a small coin shop on East High Street close to Schaefer Junior High School where he taught math. Many students visited his coin shop to fill their blue coin books from his pot of coins, which some believe Larry seeded so the books could be filled with ease. For several years, he made his coin shop available for the club meetings.

E. Lawrence Brooks Jr. was a man who valued education and public service. He was a teacher's advocate, serving as president of both the teacher's association and teacher's union. He worked in the central office of Springfield City Schools as a math coordinator. He also was president of the Evening Optimist and helped coach little league baseball.

Over time the Clark County Coin Club has been an ongoing organization which has had several members contribute to it. The Clark County Coin Club scholarship originally founded in 1999 in honor of Larry has been expanded to include other members who have contributed significantly to the Clark County Coin Club and have been recognized by the club to be honored as a contributor. Basic Requirements:

To qualify for the scholarship, high school students must:

1. Have a high school grade point average of 2.0 or better based on a 4.0 scale
2. Be accepted as a full time student (12 or more credit hours) in a state accredited institution of higher learning

Scholarship Amount:

A one-time award of \$500.00 will be awarded to an individual upon verification of enrollment in an institution of higher learning. If funds allow, there may be additional awards.

The 2019 winner was from Springfield Global Impact STEM Academy.

Clark County Coin Club Memorial Scholarship Award Selection Process

Each application consists of the following:

1. application form completed by student
2. activities/awards list for student
3. applicant's essay on topic selected

Each application will be read and essay reviewed by coin club members. After the reviewers have read and reviewed the materials, he/she must initial the first page of each document in the lower right corner and return to scholarship coordinator. A winner and runner up will be selected.

In the event that the winner is unable to meet the award criteria within 30 days, the award may be given to the runner up by decision of the Clark County Coin Club.

All applications should be evaluated according to the following scale:

Compliance to the guidelines.....	possible fifteen (15) points
Essay	possible thirty-five (35) points
Total	possible fifty (50) points
